

Emergency Contraception/Post-Coital Contraception/ Patient Education

Policy:

The purpose of PCC (post-coital contraception) is to prevent pregnancy following sexual intercourse.

Scope:

Emergency Department

Responsibilities:

ED Physician and RN assist with prescription and medication administration as necessary.

Control:

Nursing Administration, Administrator, Board of Commissioners, Pharmacy

Procedure:

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- 1. Obtain a urine pregnancy test. Proceed only if test result is negative.
- 2. Provide both verbal and written education regarding Post-Coital Contraception (PCC) to the patient.
- 3. Informed consent is needed. Have the patient or legal guardian sign consent if PCC is requested.
- 4. The Sexual Assault Examiner also signs the form after the patient's signature if applicable.
- 5. Inform the patient that her menstrual period should begin within three weeks. She should see her primary care physician for a pregnancy test and exam if menstruation

has not started within three weeks of emergency contraceptive dose.

6. Give Plan B (Levonorgestrel) in the Emergency Department (ED).
